Attendance Information – Based on **current** Washington State requirements we are only permitted to have 50% capacity in Temple at one time and at the same time 50% capacity in the parish hall. Therefore, space is limited for all liturgies. Attendance is first come - first to worship in the Temple. The parish hall and outside areas are available for any overflow.

Washington State requires that a mask be worn by all capable individuals, and all items that are touched are to be cleaned with disinfectant wipes after use. Proper social distancing is also required (*six feet of separation between family/household units*).

Second Sunday After Pentecost – June 6, 2021

“Immediately they left their nets and followed him.” Hearing the call, Peter, Andrew, James and John left one calling to become fishers of men. The life of prayer and devotion in monasticism and holy orders is a special way to live this calling. Is Christ calling you to follow him?

Third Sunday After Pentecost – June 13, 2021

“Seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness.” Our Lord challenged and always challenges his followers to be sure to seek his will. Spiritual fathers and mothers can be guides to help others so that we do not love mammon instead of God. Is a life of increased prayer and devotion to God something he is asking you to consider by discerning a vocation to the monastic life, to the priesthood or the diaconate?

Fourth Sunday After Pentecost – June 20, 2021

“Let it be done for you as you have believed.” Jesus brought healing to the centurion’s servant when he sought healing. When we have faith and live it out, our Church can continue to share the love and healing of God to the world. 
